wasn't in a good state of mind. My mom is very critical; she usually finds anyway to yell at me. A "brat" is what she likes to call me. She has said that when I turn 18 she will kick me out of the house, which worries me because I'm turning 18 at the beginning of my senior year. She also apparently can't wait to disown me. This is just a couple of examples of how she is. I've lived through this my whole life and



before I started going to TreeHouse, it affected me a lot. I would hide in my room as soon as I got home and I'd only leave when I had to go back to school the next day. I never talked to anyone about my feelings. I kept everything in until I just broke and cried for days. The cycle would repeat after every time I broke down. I thought about suicide quite a bit and I thought about cutting.

Then I went to TreeHouse. It felt nice leaving the house to visit with people and talk about my feelings. One of my favorite things about TreeHouse is letting everything out and having people there to support me. It truly is a safe place and a second home. I normally don't get to talk at home, so, I love feeling like I can actually say what I want to say and not be ignored. I really like Thursdays especially because I get to learn about God and about the Bible. Because of this I accepted Jesus as my savior about 3 months ago.

I've been going to TreeHouse for over a year and a half now and I have changed a lot. I'm definitely more outgoing. TreeHouse got me out of my shell. I used to always need a friend to go with me whenever I went somewhere with people in it because my social anxiety was so bad. I didn't want to be alone with all of those people. TreeHouse helped me so much that I just acted in a play by myself with none of my friends around. My communication skills have improved; I now say out loud what I think in my head.

Whenever someone asks what TreeHouse was about I would always say, "It's teenagers talking about how their week went and the emotions that went with it". One of the best things is people giving their support. It shows that someone cares and they know what you're going through and you're never alone. There's still a lot of things to work

on but TreeHouse has already helped with more than enough things and I am very thankful to have the opportunity to go because I know there's a lot of teens going through what I have, and still am, in this world that just don't get this chance.

We also want to encourage you to tell the teens in your life about TreeHouse—Sandstone. The teens we serve are not all juvenile delinquents.
